“ *Bryan and I have known each other since around 1980. We had so many things in common: interest in the Indian culture, construction, working out, philosophizing about life, spirituality, dancing/partying, nature....on and on. A few things I will remember most about Bryan are how helpful he always was--he would give you his time, talents and his heart. He also was quick to laugh and had a boyish appreciation of the simple things in life. When he came out to San Diego we were ocean kayaking and were paddling after some dolphins headed out of San Diego bay. We thought we lost the dolphins. Bryan was ahead of me with his kayak perpendicular to the path of the dolphins looking for them. Suddenly 2 dolphins surfaced and then dove under the bow & stern of his kayak simultaneously. Seconds later a third surfaced and went under the middle of his kayak only a few feet away where he was sitting--and as it dove under it flipped it's tail and splashed Bryan. It was an incredible experience. Water was running off his hat and face and he was smiling but had to keep his mouth close to keep the water out. I'll never forget that moment and that smile. And Bryan always said "I love you Man" before he hung up the phone. I couldn't ask for more from a friend.*
