



## Dr. David William Myers Jr.

February 10, 1944 - October 8, 2015

Dr. David W. Myers, 71, of Kansas City, Missouri, passed away Thursday, October 8th, 2015, at North Kansas City Hospital following a courageous battle with cancer. He is survived by his wife of 41 years, Vicki Myers; his sister, seven sons and 15 grandchildren. He was born February 10th, 1944 in Carroll County, MO; the son of David and Irene (Jones) Myers. After graduating from Hardin High School, he went on to play football for the University of Missouri until being accepted for early admission into the university's prestigious School of Medicine. Upon graduating medical school with honors, Dr. Myers served his country as an officer in the Army National Guard before embarking on a medical career spanning 42 years.

His childhood spent working on a farm cultivated aptitudes for hard work and nurturing life that would serve him well as a distinguished OB/GYN.

Respected for his compassionate but authoritative manner, Dr. Myers never wavered in a lifelong commitment to his patients that saw him deliver thousands of babies, incredibly, all of which he could recall upon introduction over the years. Known by loved ones and colleagues alike as a man of steadfast faith and wisdom, David was also known for his love of family, country, trains, music, RV'ing and finding any reason to fire up a John Deere tractors for work or play around his home in Smithville where he raised his family.
