Sam L. Stull entered this life on June 1, 1944 in Hastings, Nebraska, the son of Lee and Lorene (Osborne) Stull. He departed this life on December 4, 2013, at the age of 69 years, at home in Kansas City, MO after a lingering illness.

He graduated from Lincoln Southeast High School in Nebraska in 1962. He was inducted into the U.S. Army on June 5, 1962, and Honorably discharge Sept. 18, 1969.
